

Fundraiser a \$32k triumph despite wet conditions

WET weather and shivering conditions didn't stop the punters visiting Hawkesbury Race Course on the Queens Birthday public holiday to support the Hawkesbury AFL Club's bid to raise money for a new clubhouse.

The day was a huge success for the club, walking away with a whopping \$32,000 thanks to the fundraising efforts of the Richmond Club in conjunction with Hawkesbury Race Club.

The Monday meet was a full eight race program, and off-track entertainment for kids ensured the whole family enjoyed a fun day out.

AFL legends Craig and Nick Davis were in attendance to speak at the private luncheon and mingle with the kids.

Auctions and raffles were held on the day, and local businesses and residents dug deep in support of the club.

Club president Darren Barlow said he was blown away by the support of the community.

"We were expecting to raise around \$20,000,

but the final figure of \$32,000 was just fantastic," Barlow said.

"It was great to see the community giving so much towards this project."

A junior AFL match was held half way through the race program, and new club the Greater Western Sydney Giants had representatives in attendance to boost the profile of the sport.

Barlow said AFL in the Hawkesbury has taken a huge leap forward with the introduction of free memberships, and estimates player numbers to double with the introduction of the GWS Giants in the national league.

Plans for the new clubhouse and amenities building have been approved through council, and with the money raised from the race meet, construction of the building will soon commence.

A trivia night fundraiser for the project will take place on August 13 at the Richmond Club from 7pm, with tickets on sale for \$10 per person.


